- · Identify risk factors for adverse drug reactions
- · Describe a management approach to best treat the symptoms of Lewy Body Dementia
- · Recognize the risk and benefits of treating insomnia in the elderly
- · Appreciate the importance of the gait assessment in preventing falls
- Recognize when behavioral modifications are preferred over pharmaceutical approaches for management of dementia and BPSD
- Discuss strategies to promote a successful medical visit for autistic children
- · Recognize signs of Child Abuse
- Recognize the changes to bilirubin management in the updated AAP guidelines
- · Identify pediatric gastrointestinal problems
- · Recognize the signs of nicotine dependence and withdrawl
- Describe the ossification and fusion of the elbow ossification centers
- Recognize basic exercise terminology
- Recognize clinical signs and symptoms suggestive of autoimmune inflammatory disorders
- · Discuss screening for pre-participation examinations for special needs athletes
- Expand away from the area of pain and look along the full kinetic chain for mechanical deficits as a precursor to overuse injuries
