OVERVIEW

Rowan-Virtua School of Osteopathic Medicine is dedicated to refining and enhancing knowledge to manage the changing needs of the healthcare system. This education-based lecture series is structured to augment the health care professional's expertise with current clinical guideline recommendations and materials, as well as up-to-date advances in medical treatments on specific topics.

In response to evaluations from previous activity participants, focused education blocks were developed to cover the following topics: Cardiology & Nephrology, Pediatrics & Obstetrics, Geriatrics, Psychiatry, Neurology, and Musculoskeletal Conditions. Lecturing faculty were chosen based on their clinical research, thorough experience, and clinical distinction in their respective fields. This series allows health care professionals, to gather and discover convenient, current recommendations and protocols and advances in treatments in each of the chosen focus areas.

GENERAL LEARNING OBJECTIVES

As a result of participation in this activity, members of the interprofessional team will improve their ability to:

- Recognize indications for nephrology referral and co-management
- Differentiate when BP lowering strategies prioritize renal protection vs cardiovascular risk reduction
- Collaboratively manage hypertension-associated atherosclerotic cardiovascular disease and hypertensive heart disease
- Characterize the feedback between the renal and cardiovascular systems in the setting of heart failure
- Identify best practices for breast cancer screening in high-risk women
- Develop patient-centered management plans for symptom control, health risks, and preventive care during the menopausal transition
- Identify the roles needed on a care team when providing patient-centered care to immigrant patients
- Implement cross-disciplinary treatment plans to address a patient's physical and psychosocial needs
- Promote collaboration between health care providers, therapists, and school team to support patients with developmental and behavioral needs
- Describe the members and role of an interdisciplinary team in caring for older adults and identify high-risk medications
- Collaborate with the interprofessional team to integrate occupational therapy in geriatric care
- Navigate goals-of-care discussions with older adults and their families
- Recognize the role of additional disciplines to help manage and prevent falls in the elderly population
- Identify the roles of health care professionals involved in medical aid in dying and apply eligibility criteria to the patient qualification process
- Identify patients with MCI/mild dementia due to Alzheimer's disease and take initial steps in evaluating and referring them for anti-amyloid therapies
- Identify and manage behavioral changes in the brain injury population
- Identify and manage developmental delays
- Identify two complications of severe persistent catatonia
- Distinguish seizures from syncope by recognizing key historical clues
- Anticipate growth plate disasters by identifying and managing specific critical conditions
- Collaboratively discuss emerging treatment strategies for knee pain
- Promote a better understanding of collaborative care in sports and orthopedic injuries
- Differentiate the responsibilities of athletic trainers play and other health care professionals in the management of acute injuries
