OVERVIEW

Rowan-Virtua School of Osteopathic Medicine is dedicated to refining and enhancing physicians' knowledge to manage the changing needs of the healthcare system. This education-based lecture series is structured to augment physician expertise with current clinical guideline recommendations and materials, as well as up-to-date advances in medical treatments on specific topics.

In response to evaluations from previous activity participants, focused education blocks were developed to cover the following topics: Psychiatry, Geriatrics, Cardiology, Pediatrics, Women's Health, Vascular Surgery and Musculoskeletal Conditions. Lecturing faculty were chosen based on their clinical research, thorough experience, and clinical distinction in their respective fields. This series allows a prominent group of physicians to gather and discover convenient, current recommendations and protocols and advances in treatments in each of the chosen focus areas.

GENERAL LEARNING OBJECTIVES

As a result of participation in this activity, members of the interprofessional team will improve their ability to:

- Collaboratively review the role of medication-assisted treatment (MAT) in the
 management of opioid use disorder (OUD), alcohol use disorder (AUD) and
 treatments for stimulant use disorder, including their mechanisms of action,
 indications, contraindications, and comparative
- Identify three psychotherapeutic/psychiatric techniques that a healthcare team may utilize for treatment of chronic pain conditions
- Review components of a team-based approach on how to educate patients on taking medications when indicated in the perinatal period
- Identify evidence-based techniques for how the health care team can approach youth who are unwilling to invest in treatment
- Identify and assess the different types of eating disorders in an out-patient setting
- Collaboratively identify and screen older adults for Substance Use Disorder
- Health care professionals will be able to recognize the complexity and considerations in caring for the elderly during urgent care visits to ensure safe effective patient-centered care and identify the importance of prognostication in clinical-decision making for older adults
- Construct a goals-of-care conversation in patients with advance disease and life limiting illness by integrating perspectives from members of the health care team
- · Identify the 5 Ms of an Age-Friendly Health System
- · Manage patients with cardiovascular disease
- Address episodes of pediatric syncope to promote team work amongst the health care team and accelerated treatment for these children to improve health outcomes.
- Improve interprofessional communication about signs of perimenopausal symptoms so that all members of the health care team will be able to quickly identify presenting symptoms and treatment plans, resulting in better management
- Identify the specific health care needs of children with military parents as they
 are often moving frequently and do not have the same medical providers for
 long periods of time; the ability of residents, nurses, and physicians to recognize
 the common, unique issues of this population will result in quicker care interventions
 and medical outcomes for them
- Clearly define roles when providing care to patients with musculoskeletal injuries at sporting events and/or other activities
- Collaboratively assess and identify indicators of underlying lower extremity pain that may represent a true medical emergency
- Use best practices for interprofessional communication to ensure ultrasound is used when appropriate
- Review pathophysiology, diagnosis and treatment of thoracic outlet syndrome including robotic, open and endovascular treatments
